



# Using the control menu

The control menu is shown below. To access the menu, press the MENU button. Scroll through options with the ▼



(down) and ▲ (up) buttons. Press ENTER to select an option. To return to a higher level in the menu, press MENU. To exit the menu, press and hold MENU or wait a few seconds.

# DMX mode operation and settings

#### DMX channel mode ([hfln])

The Compact PAR 64 LED has 2 DMX modes that use 6 or 9 channels. The 6-channel mode provides color mixing with 0-100% control of each color: red, blue green, amber, white, and UV. In 9-channel mode, the Compact PAR 64 LED provides color mixing, 36 popular preset colors, full-range dimming, and strobe effects. The DMX command tables list all functions and their values.

To set 6-channel or 9-channel DMX mode:

- 1. Press MENU to enter the control menu.
- 2. Scroll to EhAn. Press ENTER to confirm.
- 3. Scroll to the desired mode: 5 [h or 9 [h.
- 1. Press ENTER to save your selection.

# DMX address (Addr)

A DMX controller uses either 6 or 9 DMX channels to control the Compact PAR 64 LED. The DMX address is the first channel used. If fixtures are set to 6-channel DMX mode and the first fixture's DMX address is set to 1, then it receives instructions on DMX channels 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6. The next fixture could then be set to a DMX address of 7.

For independent control, each fixture must have its own unique control channels. For symmetric control, identical fixtures can be set to the same DMX address.

Assign an address for the fixture on the DMX controller. Then set that address on the Compact PAR 64 LED as follows:

- 1. Press MENU to enter the control menu.
- 2. Scroll to Addr. Press ENTER.
- 3. Scroll to the address that you assigned to the fixture.
- 4. Press ENTER to save the address.

### DMX state (d∏H)

The fixture runs in DMX mode whenever it receives DMX signals. When there is no DMX signal, the fixture can be set to run in Show Mode (5HoL), black out (bLEH), or hold the last DMX values received (HoLd). For Show Mode operation, DMX state must be set to 5HoU.

To select behavior when there is no DMX signal:

- 1. Select d∩H in the control menu and press ENTER.
- 2. Select the desired behavior: 5HoU, bLEH, or HoLd.
- . Press ENTER to save your selection.

# Show mode operation and settings

Show mode lets you run a standalone light show without a DMX controller. Shows can be triggered by sound, or automatically triggered at eight speeds.

To enable Show Mode operation, set the DMX state setting to  $5H_0U$ .

#### Show selection (5h0U)

Four shows are available. To select a preprogrammed show:

- Press MENU to enter the control menu.
- 2. Scroll to 5h0U and press ENTER.
- 3. Select 5h\_ and press ENTER.
- Select a show from 5h 1 to 5h 4, or select aFF to disable Show Mode. Press ENTER.

# Music trigger (50Un and 52n5)

The fixture's built-in microphone triggers effect and color changes in sync with music. To enable sound activation:

- 1. Select 5 dun in the control menu and press ENTER.
- 2. Select on to enable sound activation or off to disable it.
- 3. Press ENTER to save your selection.

To adjust microphone sensitivity for the volume of the music:

- 1. Turn on the music source and set it to the desired volume.
- 2. Select 52 n5 in the control menu and press ENTER.
- 3. Press ▼ or ▲ to decrease or increase the sensitivity level.
- 4. When the fixture responds as desired, press ENTER.

# Auto trigger speed (5PEd)

To use auto trigger in Show Mode:

- 1. Turn off sound activation as described above.
- 2. Select 5h0U in the control menu and press ENTER.
- 3. Scroll to 5PEd. Press ENTER.
- 4. Select a trigger speed from 1 (slow) to 8 (fast). Press ENTER.

# Master/slave mode operation and settings

Up to 32 Compact PAR 64 LEDs can be linked in a chain and set to master/slave operation, where the first Compact PAR 64 LED in the chain is set to operate as the "master" that controls the others. This provides synchronized operation without a controller.

Note: There must be no more than one master in the chain. Set all other connected fixtures to operate as slaves.


To set the first fixture to be the master:

- 1. Enter the control menu and scroll to ΠR5L. Press ENTER.
- 2. Scroll to NASE. Press ENTER.
- 3. Set show mode options as described above.

To set other fixtures as slaves:

- 1. Enter the control menu and scroll to ΠA5L. Press ENTER.
- 2. Scroll to 5LAu. Press ENTER.

Link the master and slave fixtures in a chain, using DMX cable to connect each fixture's DMX OUT socket to the next fixture's DMX IN socket as described in the Safety and Installation Guide.



# Other settings

# LED display on/off (LEd)

To set the control panel's LED display to be on all the time, or to automatically sleep when not in use:

- 1. Select dl 5P in the control menu and press ENTER.
- 2. Select LEd and press ENTER.
- 3. Select on (display on) or off (display off when not in use).
- 4. Press ENTER to save your selection.

# LCD display inversion (I nur)

To invert the control panel's LED display for easier reading:

- 1. Select d 15P in the control menu and press ENTER.
- 2. Select I nur and press ENTER.
- 3. Select £5 to invert the display.
- 4. Press ENTER to save your selection or MENU to escape.

#### Manual mode (ПЯпи)

Effects can be set from the control panel. To keep the effect settings, do not exit the menu.

See the 9-channel mode DMX table for command values. To set effects from the control panel:

- 1. Enter the control menu and scroll to ☐AnU. Press ENTER.
- 2. Scroll to the color or effect to adjust. Press ENTER.
- 3. Press ▼ or ▲ to specify a value from 0 to 255 for the effect.
- 4. Press ENTER to set the effect.
- 5. Press MENU and repeat for the other colors or effects.

### Auto test (£25£)

To test all of the fixture functions select £25£ and press ENTER. Press MENU to exit the test routine.

#### **Fixture readouts**

Hours: To display the fixture's total operating hours select FHr5 and press ENTER. Press MENU to exit.

Firmware: To display the firmware version number, select  $\square Pr$  and press ENTER. Press MENU to exit.

#### **Settings reset**

To return all user settings to the factory default values, select r5L in the control menu. Press ENTER to confirm or MENU to escape.

### Remote control operation

The remote control works with all Compact PAR 64 LED fixtures within range.

To operate the Compact PAR 64 LED with the remote control:

- 1. Verify that the fixture is not connected to a DMX controller.
- 2. Press MENU to enter the control menu.
- 3. Scroll to 5h0U and press ENTER.
- 4. Select 5h\_ and press ENTER.
- 5. Select oFF to disable Show Mode. Press ENTER.
- To execute commands, point the remote control towards the front of the fixture and the press corresponding button. See table below.

#### Replacing the wireless remote control battery

The wireless remote control uses a single CR 2025 coin/button/cell 3 V lithium battery. To replace the battery:

- Depress the battery tray lock on the reverse of the remote control and slide out the battery tray. Remove the old battery.
- Insert a fresh battery with the positive terminal towards the back of the remote. A diagram on the remote control indicates the correct orientation.
- 3. Align the battery tray to the remote control and re-insert the tray ensuring that the locking mechanism is secure.
- 4. Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations.

If the coin/button/cell battery compartment does not close securely, stop using the product and keep away from children and animals. Contact Martin Professional for service and support.

#### Introduction

The THRILL Compact PAR 64 LED is a compact color-mixing lighting fixture with 5 long-life six-color LED emitters. It provides strobe effects, full-range dimming, and full 0-100% control of its red, green, blue, white, amber, and UV light. The lightweight construction and flexible control options make it ideal for mobile DJs and small venues.

It is supplied with this guide, a user guide, power cables, a remote control, and a multi-function bracket for attachment of a suitable rigging clamp (not included), or use as a floor stand.

## Before installing and using the fixture:

- 1. Read the safety information.
- Unpack the fixture and ensure that there is no transportation damage. Do not attempt to operate a damaged fixture.
- 3. Ensure that your AC voltage and frequency match the power requirements of the fixture.


The maximum current through the MAINS OUT socket is of 3 A. Do not use the MAINS OUT socket to connect power to more than:

- Six (6) additional Compact PAR 64 LED fixtures at 100-120 V,
- Ten (10) additional Compact PAR 64 LED fixtures at 200-240 V.

#### Protection from burns and fire



Do not operate the fixture if the ambient temperature (Ta) exceeds 40° C (104° F).



Keep flammable materials well away from the fixture. Keep all combustible materials (e.g. fabric, wood, paper) at least 100 mm (4 in.) away from the fixture.

Ensure that there is free and unobstructed airflow around the fixture. Provide a minimum clearance of 100 mm (4 in.) around fans and air vents.

Do not illuminate surfaces within 200 mm (8 in.) of the fixture. Do not attempt to bypass thermostatic switches or fuses

Do not stick filters, masks or other materials onto any optical

The fixture's lenses can focus the sun's rays inside the fixture, creating a risk of fire and damage. Do not expose the front of the fixture to sunlight or any other bright light source.

Fasten the fixture securely to a fixed surface or structure when in use. The fixture is not portable when installed.

Ensure that any supporting structure and/or hardware used can hold at least 10 times the weight of all the devices they support and complies with locally applicable regulations.

To suspend the fixture from a rigging structure, use a suitable rigging clamp. Do not use safety cables as the primary means of

If the product is installed in a location where it may cause injury or damage if it falls, install as directed a secondary attachment such as a safety cable that will hold the machine if a primary attachment fails. The secondary attachment must be approved by an official body such as TÜV as a safety attachment for the weight that it secures, must comply with EN 60598-2-17 Section 17.6.6 or BGV C1 / DGUV 17, and must be capable of bearing a static suspended load at least six times the weight of the fixture (or more if required by locally applicable regulations). Check that all external covers and rigging hardware are securely fastened.

Block access below the work area and work from a stable platform whenever installing, servicing or moving the fixture.


Do not operate the fixture with missing or damaged covers, shields or any optical component.

In the event of an operating problem, stop using the fixture immediately and disconnect it from power. Do not attempt to use a fixture that is obviously damaged.

Do not modify the fixture in any way not described in this manual or install other than genuine Martin parts.

Flashing light can trigger epileptic seizures in flicker-sensitive persons. Provide notice when strobe lighting is in use at the entrance(s) to the venue. # Fixture overview Physical installation



The THRILL Compact PAR 64 LED is designed for indoor use only and must be used in a dry location with adequate

Fasten the fixture to a secure structure or surface. Do not stand it on a surface or leave it where it can be moved or fall over. If you install the fixture in a location where it may cause injury or damage if it falls, secure it as directed using a securely anchored safety cable that will hold the fixture if the primary fastening

# Fastening the fixture to a flat surface

The fixture can be fastened to a hard, fixed, flat surface. Ensure that the surface and all fasteners used can support at least 10 times the weight of all fixtures and equipment they support and comply with locally applicable regulations.

Fasten the fixture securely. Do not stand it on a surface or leave it where it can be moved or fall over. To use the bracket as a floor

- 1. Loosen the hand wheels on both sides of the bracket.
- Unfold the bracket as required, taking caution not to over extend the bracket.
- 3. Position the fixture and adjust the tilt angle.
- 4. Tighten both hand wheels. Do not over-tighten.

#### Mounting the fixture on a truss

The fixture can be clamped to a truss or similar rigging structure. It must be suspended vertically, hanging downwards only. Use a suitable rigging clamp such as a super lightweight halfcoupler clamp (shown to right) fastened to the included clamp attachment bracket.

To clamp the fixture to a truss:

- 1. Check that the rigging structure can support at least 10 times the weight of all fixtures and equipment to be installed on it and complies with locally applicable regulations.
- Block access under the work area.
- Fold the two parts of the multi-function bracket together.
- 4. Bolt a rigging clamp securely to the supplied clampattachment bracket. The bolt used must be M12, grade 8.8 steel minimum, and fastened with a self-locking nut or wingnut/self-locking washer combination
- Working from a stable platform, hang the fixture vertically on the truss and fasten the rigging clamp to the truss.
- Secure the fixture with a safety cable as directed.
- 7. Tilt the fixture as desired and tighten the hand wheels.

## Securing with a safety cable

Secure the THRILL Compact PAR 64 LED with a safety cable or other secondary attachment that is approved for the weight of the fixture to prevent it from falling if the primary attachment fails. Loop the safety cable through the secondary attachment point on the rear mounting plate and around a secure anchoring

Do not loop the safety cable around the mounting bracket only, as this will leave the fixture unsecured if it separates from the bracket.

# AC power




For protection from electric shock, the fixture must be grounded (earthed). The power distribution circuit must be equipped with a fuse or circuit breaker and groundfault (earth-fault) protection.

The fixture has an auto-ranging power supply that accepts 100-240 V AC mains power at 50/60 Hz. Do not apply AC mains power at any other voltage or frequency. To prevent damage, do not use an external dimming system to supply power.

If a suitable IEC extension cord is obtained, additional fixtures may be connected to the MAINS OUT socket, but do not exceed a current load of 3 A. If supplying power to additional Compact PAR 64 LED fixtures, you may connect up to:

- Six (6) additional Compact PAR 64 LED fixtures at 100-120 V,
- Ten (10) additional Compact PAR 64 LED fixtures at 200-240 V.

# Control data link



The DMX IN socket is for connection to a DMX-512 controller. The DMX OUT socket may be used to connect a total of up to 32 fixtures in a daisy chain for DMX operation or synchronized master/slave operation.

Use 3-pin XLR DMX data cable. Microphone cable is designed for audio signals and is unreliable for data transmission.

Terminate the data link by installing a termination plug in the output of the last fixture. The termination plug "soaks up" the control signal so it does not reflect and cause interference.

### Maintenance



Do not open the housing, there are no user serviceable parts inside the fixture.

Disconnect the fixture from mains power before performing maintenance.

The user may carry out the maintenance operations described below. Do not attempt to repair a defective fixture. Refer all service to your Martin dealer or contact Martin directly for technical support through www.martin.com/contact-support.

#### Cleaning

The Compact PAR 64 LED must be cleaned periodically. Excessive dust, effect fluid, and particle buildup degrades performance, causes overheating and will damage the fixture. Damage caused by inadequate cleaning is not covered by the product warranty.

The cleaning schedule will vary greatly depending on the operating environment. Inspect the fixture once a month and clean if necessary. Inspect every 1-2 weeks if the fixture is frequently used with effects machines, in locations with heavy cigarette smoke, operated or stored in a dusty location, or installed near an air duct. This procedure will allow you to assess cleaning requirements in your particular situation.

Keep the fixture dry and use gentle pressure when cleaning. Work in a clean, well-lit area. Do not use any cleanser that contains solvents or abrasives, as these can cause surface damage.

To clean the fixture:

- 1. Disconnect the fixture from power and allow it to cool.
- Disconnect the fixture from power and allow it to cool.
- Clean the casing and lenses by wiping gently with a soft, clean microfiber cloth. Remove stuck particles with an unscented tissue or cotton swab moistened with distilled water. Do not rub hard.

#### Replacing the primary fuse

#### Replace fuse with same size and specified rating only.

If the fixture is completely dead, the primary fuse may have blown and it may be necessary to install a new fuse. A spare fuse is located in the fuse holder.

#### **Physical**
